Washington, DC - Six months after American Rivers released America's Most Endangered Rivers™: 2009 edition last April, thousands of Americans have taken action and critical decisions on many of the rivers are expected soon.

Each year, the America's Most Endangered Rivers report highlights the rivers facing the most uncertain futures. The report presents alternatives to proposals that would damage rivers, identifies those who make the crucial decisions, and points out opportunities for the public to take action on behalf of each listed river.

"Thousands of Americans have taken action on behalf of these endangered rivers this year," said Rebecca Wodder, president of American Rivers. "This six-month check-in serves to keep these rivers in the public eye, and remind decision makers that actions are still needed."
